# **Testing Students Experiencing Disabilities**

Children experiencing disabilities may be evaluated for satisfactory educational progress according to the recommendations of an individualized education plan (IEP) or privately developed plan (PDP) in lieu of regular home school testing per OAR 581-021-0029.



# **Testing for Interscholastic Activities**

Home school students establishing eligibility for interscholastic activities (activities where schools compete) **must test annually** at the end of each school year (prior to Aug. 15th) because test scores are used to determine eligibility for the following year.

# **High School Level Students**

A high school level home school students are not able to substitute other tests – GED, SAT, ACT, etc. – for a required home school test.

# **No Home School Testing Opt Out**


There is no opt out from home school testing. The Student Assessment Bill of Rights (ORS 329.479) permits parents of public school students to optout of Oregon's statewide testing given in public schools, and does not apply to home school students.

Home school students are required to be tested at the end of grades 3, 5, 8 and 10 by August 15 per OAR 581-021-0026(5).

If a student completes the 3rd, 5th, 8th or 10th grade during this 18-month window of time, testing does not need to occur until the next required grade level.

If the student has never attended public or private school, the first test must be taken at the end of 3rd grade.

Parents are responsible for all testing arrangements and costs.

#### **Local Home School Testers**

Tests must be given by a qualified and neutral person as defined in OAR 581-021-0026(1)(e)(i). Under Oregon law, parents may not be the proctor for their own student.
